


Honored Friend,

Having learned from a copy of the defunct, "Once a *meek*" (?) that you are an official of the Sons of American Revolution, I write to ask if you can inform me if there is a historical list of the soldiers of the Revolution that tells of their parentage and subsequent *abode*(?)! Putnams Historical Magazine, Jan 1896 gives in the list of men who "marched to Scituate and Marshfield on the alarm of the 19<sup>th</sup> of April 1775, a "sergeant" Thomas Fuller. I want to know if that Fuller was a descendent of the Edward Fuller who came to America in the....he was my maternal Great Grandmother's cousin but whether her name too was \_\_\_\_(?) I do not know, only that she was Canadian French.
